OPERAIE IN TURIN

A host of workshops and lectures augment the fourth edition of Operae in Turin, Italy, October 11 to 13. Dedicated to independent and self-produced design, this festival-cum-laboratory champions new technologies, modes of production, and solutions to design problems. Speakers include BCXSY (Boaz Cohen and Sayaka Yomamoto) and Alvaro Catalán de Ocón, who will discuss his Pet Lamp collection, in which he repurposes used plastic bottles into light fixtures inspired by local textile traditions. operae.biz

PAD LONDON

This fall's PAD London—now in its seventh edition—runs October 16 to 20. Including diverse and prestigious galleries hailing from twelve countries, the fair brings together purveyors of design, modern art, decorative arts, photography, and tribal art with the intention of inspiring a cross-genre approach to collecting. Fashion designer Reed Krakoff conceived the design project serving as the fair's entrance, which incorporates solar lamps created by engineer Evans Wadongo. The lamps' sales will benefit Wadongo's not-for-profit organization Sustainable Development for All-Kenya (SDFA-Kenya).

At the same time Frieze London initiates its eleventh year, bringing to Regent's Park 150 exhibitors of contemporary art.
